

# Deadlines By County

## Mandatory E-Filing

## Supreme Court Ruling

E-filing will be mandatory in civil cases in the district courts, statutory county courts, constitutional county courts and statutory probate courts according to the following implementation schedule based upon the counties' 2010 Federal Census population:

- a. Courts in counties with a population of 500,000 or more January 1, 2014
- b. Courts in counties with a population of 200,000 to 499,999 July 1, 2014
- c. Courts in counties with a population of 100,000 to 199,999 January 1, 2015
- d. Courts in counties with a population of 50,000 to 99,999 July 1, 2015
- e. Courts in counties with a population of 20,000 to 49,999 January 1, 2016
- f. Courts in counties with a population less than 20,000 July 1, 2016

NOTE: Courts may elect to mandate electronic filing before the date prescribed by the Supreme Court. Please consult www.eFileTexas.gov for more information.
